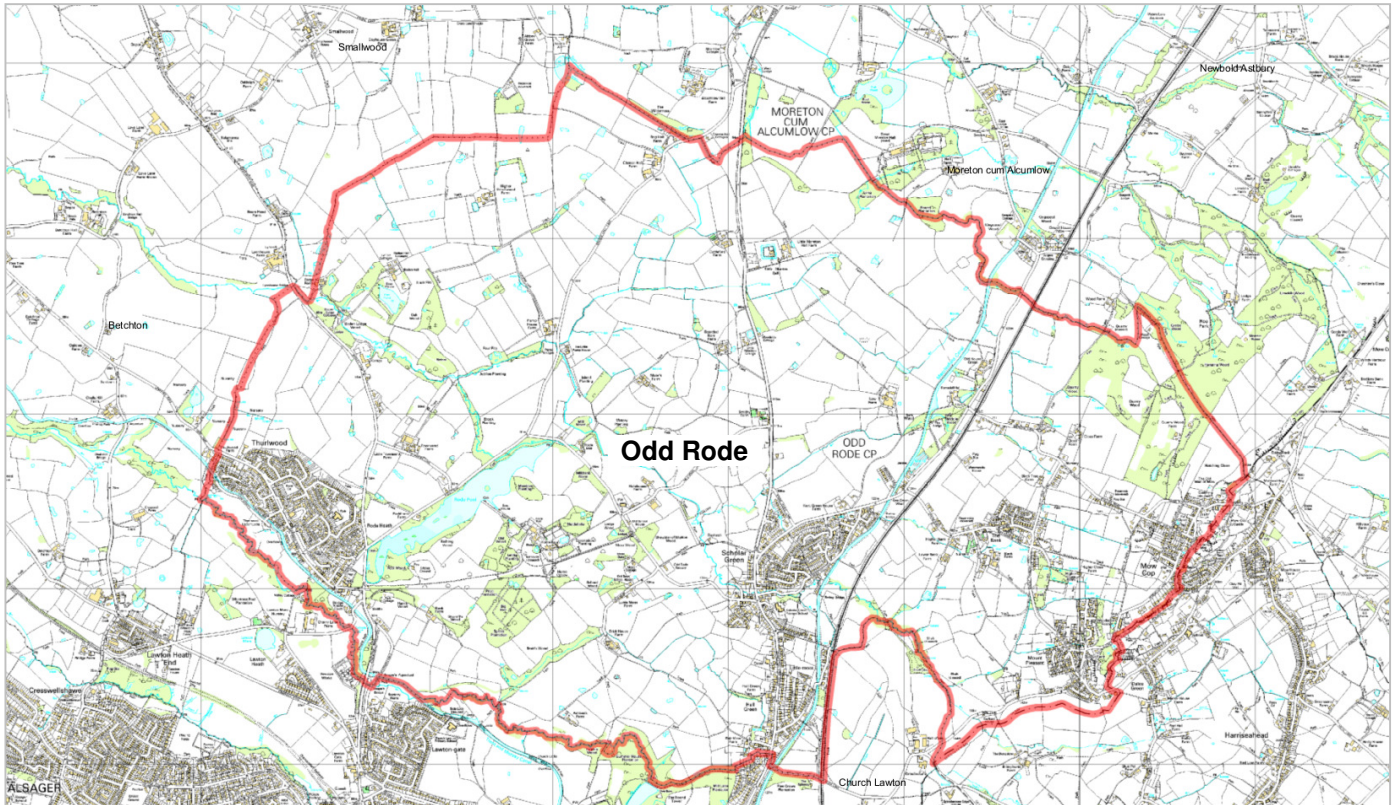

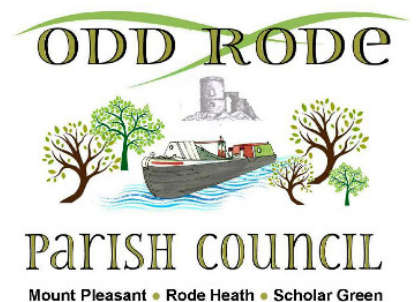

Odd Rode Parish Council Neighbourhood Development Plan

The civil Parish of Odd Rode consists of the villages of Rode Heath & Thurlwood, Scholar Green, Mount Pleasant and the Cheshire side of Mow Cop, together with the surrounding countryside and individual dwellings. Without exception, outside the village boundaries all land is currently designated as Green Belt and has protection from development. However, this designation may well be changed by Cheshire East Council.

1. **WHAT IS A NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN?**

An official document that will provide a guide for the development of our parish over the next ten years.

2. **WHO WILL WRITE THE PLAN?**

A committee of volunteer parish residents that was set up after a public meeting held in Scholar Green Village Hall in January 2016. (See previous copies of the parish publication ON THE RODE.)

3. **WHY SHOULD I COMPLETE THIS QUESTIONNAIRE?**

The next few years will see many changes in our villages! This questionnaire has been sent to every household in the Parish. This is your opportunity to say how you want your village to develop - ie as little change as possible - OR provide more facilities, housing and business opportunities for your children.

Help sessions will be available where you can meet your local Parish Councillor for explanations about the process, and raise additional ideas. These will be held in each of the three villages Rode Heath, Scholar Green and Mount Pleasant, probably in the Village Halls. Look out for banners and local posters for further details. Alternatively, any of your Parish Councillors will be happy to answer your questions.

4. **WHAT WILL HAPPEN NEXT?**

Using your answers to the questionnaire the committee will produce a draft of the plan, including specific policy statements. Then public meetings will be held to discuss the draft, and allow further contributions to the final plan. It will give you the chance to discuss how you wish to see our area develop - or not - in the next ten years. Following consultation, a parish-wide referendum will take place to check that it meets the approval of everyone voting. Finally, if approved, it will be adopted by Cheshire East Council, and the policies contained within it will be used when making planning decisions.

It will take a few minutes of your time to complete the questions. Please do not think "someone else will do it." YOUR IDEAS ARE IMPORTANT.

Please use the enclosed Freepost envelope to return your completed questionnaire by 25th August 2017.

1. 3.1 Green Belt

“*Green Belt*” land refers to an area that is kept in reserve for an open space, most often around larger cities such as Stoke on Trent. The main purpose of the green belt policy is to protect the land around larger urban centres from urban sprawl, and maintain the designated area for forestry and agriculture as well as to provide habitat to wildlife.

Green belt offers a number of benefits for both the urban and rural population. By preventing urban sprawl, it helps protect agricultural activities and the unique character of rural communities. The urban population, on the other hand, is provided with access to an open space which offers opportunities for outdoor activities.

Areas that are designated as green belt must not be built upon because green belt is defined as an open space, however, that does not mean that no buildings can be erected in green belt. Buildings for agricultural uses and sanitation facilities, for instance, are usually allowed. In some cases, it is also possible to change the use of land in green belt and even gain permission for structures that are officially not allowed in green belt (exception sites). However,

such cases are very rare and the local authorities grant permission only if no suitable site for the building can be found in the urban centres or outside the green belt.

Land can be removed from the green belt as part of a Local Plan process. Cheshire East Council has Green Belt Assessment which can be accessed at

“Brown field” refers to land that has been built on, either for housing or business use. Under current planning guidelines, any such land is preferred for development, either for future housing or business.

2 4.1 Community Assets

Community assets are privately owned building, important to a community. One way of helping to protect locally important community facilities is through a procedure called Community Right to bid. The Parish Council can nominate any local building or land as an Asset of Community Value, and it would have to be ratified by Cheshire East.

If the asset comes up for sale, the group who nominated it will have the opportunity to raise the money and put in a bid to purchase and run the community asset.

3 5.6 Quiet Lanes

Quiet Lanes are minor rural roads, typically C or unclassified routes, which have been designated by local highway authorities to pay special attention to the needs of walkers, cyclists, horse riders and other vulnerable road users, and to offer protection from speeding traffic. Cars are not banned from Quiet Lanes and the use of Quiet Lanes is shared. Measures such as lower speed limits and discrete road signs aim to encourage drivers to slow down and be considerate to more vulnerable users who can in turn use and enjoy country lanes in greater safety, with less threat from speeding traffic.
