If you haven't already done so, please complete and return the Neighbourhood Development Plan household survey questionnaire. YOUR views are important, please don't leave it to others!


You should have received a household questionnaire through your letterbox in late July/early August, together with a Freepost envelope.



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NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN

The Parish Council is urging every household to complete and return their surveys. The more responses we get, the stronger and more robust will be the resultant Neighbourhood Plan.

THE IMPORTANCE OF NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANS ...

This is what the Government says about Neighbourhood Planning:

Neighbourhood planning enables communities to play a much stronger role in shaping the areas in which they live and work and in supporting new development proposals. This is because unlike the parish plan, a neighbourhood plan forms part of the development plan and sits alongside the Local Plan prepared by the local planning authority. Decisions on planning applications will be made using both the Local Plan and the neighbourhood plan, and any other material considerations.

Neighbourhood planning provides the opportunity for communities to set out a positive vision for how they want their community to develop over the next 10, 15, 20 years in ways that meet identified local need and make sense for local people. They can put in place planning policies that will help deliver that vision or grant planning permission for the development they want to see.

A neighbourhood plan must address the development and use of land. This is because if successful at examination and referendum the neighbourhood plan will become part of the statutory development plan once it has been made (brought into legal force) by the planning authority. Applications for planning permission must be determined in accordance with the development plan, unless material considerations

A Neighbourhood Development Plan is not the same as a Parish Plan. A NDP is part of the statutory planning system and its policies will be enforced by Cheshire East Council's Planning Department, the Planning Inspectorate, the Secretary of State and the Courts.

NHDP OPEN SURGERIES


Three public surgeries are being held in each parish ward during August for residents to drop in and ask questions, make comments, etc.


